


Religion:

Curriculum

Literature:

Story structure and appreciation through a variety of literature: religious, fairy tales, poetry, and listening centers.

Writing:

Writing letters (upper & lower case) Writing name properly (upper case and lower case) Write / copy words & write numbers

Oral / Thinking Skills:

Following directions using language to express thoughts, feelings and ideas, taking turns speaking and listening in a group.

Reading:

Knows basic colors and shapes Knows upper and lower case letters Knows letter Knows name Left to right progression Identification of initial consonants and vowels

Mathematic:

Count by rote to 20 or more by ones Understand one to one correspondence Arrange objects by size and length Make a pattern using objects Understand a simple calendar Understand the day of the week & months of the year Begin basic addition using objects

Explore and Play with Rhythm, Bean Bags, Streamers, Musical Instruments and Songs.
